

A Year Apart

Adapting K-12 Curriculum for a Pandemic

The 2021 annual survey of K-12 teachers and administrators found that the COVID-19 pandemic spurred significant, lasting changes to the landscape of instructional materials.

The response to the COVID-19 pandemic forced many teachers to adopt new online teaching methods, despite a lack of online teaching experience. Teachers adopted new remote



Tracking OER Awareness

Awareness of Open licensing and Open Educational Resources (OER) saw some growth over the year, though a smaller than expected increase, given the massive shift to online instruction. However, once teachers have online course development experience, they have much higher


